From the Assistant Principal (Boarding)



From the Vice-Principal (Pastoral)

2017/2018 has been an exciting year in the development of DLD College and the boarding has been at the centre of these new changes. The concept of the Huddle was created and formed this year, with the intention of establishing a greater sense of family within the boarding accommodation with dedicated Houseparents coordinating each one. With regular meetings, Students' roles of responsibility in the form of Head and Deputy Head of Huddle and the occasional Huddle trip the intention was for the boarders to have a group that they could belong to. For next year we will evaluate how to improve the sense of community further. The trips and visits programme has also been hailed as a success of 2017/2018 with a variety of experiences open to all boarders, making the most of their London experience. I have to make a special mention of the team building activity back in September which help to create a foundation stone for the newcomers and ensure that they made some quick connections. Sleeping in wigwams and singing round a campfire in the Surrey countryside was a great experience.

With youngsters around the globe increasingly demonstrating significant mental health concerns it is important that we support all young people who are in our care with increasing vigilance. With all the Houseparent team having qualified in the Mental Health First Aid qualification and having Emily, our Counsellor and Emma, our Independent Listener available, we are ensuring we take our responsibilities seriously. From September 2018 we will welcome a new Nurse, Gina, who currently practises as a Lead Nurse in paediatric Accident & Emergency at St Thomas' Hospital, London as well as increasing the availability of Emily, our trained counsellor. In addition the College have appointed a Head of Wellbeing, who will be assessing further support structures that we can make to support all the DLD Students. By the end of the year we hope to have formulated a Health Charter for the students at DLD, with heavy influence from the students themselves.

Finally, I would like to tanks all the boarding staff for their hard work and dedication this year, to John, the Assistant Principal (Boarding) and of course all the boarders for a great year in the boarding accommodation. The boarders are central to making DLD what it is, I wish all of them a wonderful holiday. Good luck to those waiting for external examination grades and au revoir to those will see back in September.






