



DLD students go on to a range of Higher Education destinations,

including prestigious Russell Group universities such as Oxford and Cambridge as well as Imperial, King's College and UCL here in London. Some are internationally minded and head off to universities around the world, including UCLA and NYU in America. Some also pursue apprenticeships and vocational training where it fits with careerbased expectations.

In every case, future progression is determined by individual targets and achieved by embracing the outstanding teaching available here at DLD. It also goes hand in hand with an unrivalled level of personal preparedness to ensure the future is embraced with focus and confidence.

Which part of the school you join depends on your age, with younger students in Years 10 and 11 forming part of the Lower School and Sixth Form students entering the Upper School.

In the Lower School, students are welcomed into either Marylebone or Westminster House, and oversight of the cohort is provided by an Assistant Principal. Within the Upper School, students join one of five Houses: District, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern or Piccadilly, based on the iconic London Underground tube network.

This programme enables students to express themselves outside the classroom, making new friendships and developing their leadership skills along the way.

It's an innovative model that led to us being crowned the Independent Boarding School of the Year at the Independent Schools of the Year Awards 2020, where we received the additional recognition of the Special Judges' Award for our boarding experience and support structures for student welfare.

DLD College London is the only school in central London where boarding and teaching facilities share the same building, with students living immediately above the college itself. Facilities

DLD College London boasts worldclass teaching facilities, which are housed in our recently constructed purpose-built campus in the heart of central London. Students have access to state-of-the-art classrooms and equipment, providing them with the environment and all the tools they need to succeed.

Courses

DLD students benefit from a unique education that blends high-quality teaching with a flexible, supportive approach. We ensure each student is able to build his or her confidence within a happy, friendly environment.

Our course offering includes:

GCSEs: One and two-year programmes, plus an 18-month option, which are focused on providing a rigorous grounding for the demands of A Level study and other post-16 qualifications.

A Level: A large selection of subjects are on offer, helping students to access a wide range of universities and courses.

BTECs: Offering a more practical, real-world approach to learning alongside a grounding in core theory, BTEC qualifications are accepted by some of the best universities in the UK and overseas.

EPQ: Offered to all Year 12 students to stretch and challenge them beyond the syllabus, providing a strong foundation for research-led study and also providing extra UCAS points.

IFP: A selection of International Foundation Programmes are on offer as an alternative to A Levels for international students who desire a more specific pre-university experience.

APC: The Academic Preparation Course (APC) prepares a student for a main course of study in the UK. The programme is designed to prepare learners during the academic year prior to them joining GCSE, IFP and A Level courses.

BBSE: The British Boarding
Experience (BBSE) allows
international students to experience
a term studying the British
curriculum and improving their
English whilst boarding in the heart
of one of the UK's most exciting cities.

Study Support

In addition to the highly experienced teaching staff, DLD also provides a range of additional support services that enhance students' learning opportunities and assists with university applications.

UATs: The University Admissions
Tutors have specialist subject area
interests and university knowledge,
and are allocated to students based
on their intended progression. The
UAT guides the student through the
university selection and application
process and provides dedicated
hands-on support to students from
Year 12 onwards, helping them to
develop creative ideas for Personal
Statements and to evidence an
informed interest in their subject.

Neurodiversity and Learning

Support: Specialist staff work closely with teaching staff to ensure that an individual learner's needs are met within the classroom and through appropriate co-curricular activities. In addition, students have access to the on-site college nurse, counsellors and life coach as part of a holistic approach to wellbeing.

Academic English: these lessons are the educational foundation for any international student studying with us and lessons are compulsory until a minimum 6.5 IELTS score is achieved, enabling them to access further education studies.

Alpha Scholars: A unique programme of study that will develop the strengths of our most capable students who are eager to become change-makers and leaders. In addition to dedicated lessons, tailored co-curricular provision is delivered through academically focused activities that foster independent and collaborative learning, soft skills and higherorder thinking.
